### **Board President's Message**

Dear Friends,

Life in and around L/NHH is a widely different environment. Some examples:

The ReStore – Delinda, her staff and volunteers are constantly selling donated products, and the pickup crew is constantly trying to keep the product flowing. As we know, it is an imperfect world – sometimes there is too much inventory in the ReStore and sometimes not enough of the "right" stuff. From all of this, the ReStore has been a real financial asset to L/NHH since November 2021.

Build 22 – Alex and his volunteers began work above the foundation on Tuesday, 10/17. Prior to that, Alex was coordinating with the excavation, concrete, and block folks to get the foundation done. In addition, he had to work with the county and state to put a driveway in. Dick, our volunteer coordinator, has been at work trying to keep the construction work team staffed day to day. Before the foundation went in, we needed to work to ensure the property would support the septic and get the ownership of the building site closed – not hard work but time-consuming work.

Relationship with InterFaith – About a year ago we developed a relationship with InterFaith, they do short term construction projects for income disadvantaged homeowners. This is something L/NHH wanted to do in years past, but we were stretched too thin. This partnership has allowed L/NHH to fund some of these small projects (the materials) and InterFaith provides volunteer labor and building expertise. This is a great partnership, and we are pleased to have developed it.

Compliance with Habitat for Humanity International – Being an "official" Habitat Chapter means we must comply with their rules. It reminds me of a McDonalds franchise staying in compliance with "hamburger rules." This means, keeping our training up to date for things like mortgage origination, volunteer safety (many different aspects of personal safety), paying our "dues," (thanks to the ReStore) and so many other things related to policy and procedure.

These are just some aspects of our life at L/NHH. I've ignored fundraising, managing our loan portfolio, family support, family selection, real estate donation/acceptance, finance/accounting, publicity, relationship building, finding volunteers, etc., etc.

While reading about what we do at L/NHH, we feel good about where we have come in the last few years and what we've accomplished. This is a great team!!! If you want to be a part of it – contact me!!!

## **Updates on Build #22**





Construction of Build #22 began in earnest September 13 when Ransone's Nursery and Maintenance Inc. arrived on site. They began work by prepping the roadside ditch for the installation of 12" concrete pipe used as the new driveway culvert. They made quick work of this and a driveway entrance was born. The Ransone crew, led by Tom, a skilled long time contractor, moved on to excavating the house crawlspace and footers. There were quite a few dump truck loads of soil to be removed and hauled off site. The excavation continued into the following day. By Tuesday the 19th all excavation was complete and the footer had been poured. Ransone's was a real pleasure to work with and did wonderful quality work for L/NHH.

On October 2 Parker's Masonry mobilized and prepped to lay the block foundation. Parker's friendly crew worked through the week and by Friday the block foundation was complete. The block exterior finish was performed the following week and the result was a very pleasing brushed finish and is now ready for LNHH volunteers to move in

and get started.

L/NHH construction crew of volunteers got started on October 17th. We had a great group of people show up and were successful in getting the crawlspace cleaned and prepped for insulation and vapor barrier. The foundation sill plate was installed and waterproofing began on the outside of the foundation. Another fantastic group of volunteers reported for duty the following Thursday, even several repeat workers. The crawlspace insulation was installed and floor joists were staged.

We look forward to enjoying some very comfortable weather as we continue move along on build #22

   Currently living in substandard,
   overcrowded, or temporary housing, or rent is more than 30% of gross monthly income.
- Willingness to Partner.
   Each adult must complete "sweat equity" hours building theirs and others' homes, and attend homeowner education.
