Board President's Message

Dear Friends.

We just completed the groundbreaking on Build 22. What a joy!!! It was a journey to get ownership of the Build 22 site but, in the end; all is good. We should be working above the foundation in a few weeks.

Staying in compliance with HFHI is not a walk in the park. We have things to do - quarterly reports, keep our training certificates current, and payments to be made – our tithe, 10% of ReStore revenue. We've been complying for about 2 years straight. For a small Habitat Affiliate, I think we have done very well.

At our Annual Board Meeting in late July, we added 6 new Board Members, and then another one 3 weeks later. The new folks will sit through a Board Orientation in late August and we'll try to get everyone up to speed and plugged into a Committee.

Our Habitat Chapter is doing quite well; the ReStore generated over \$100,000 for the past year, fundraising is going well, our Committees are doing well, we're expanding our services to the community through our partnership with InterFaith, and we're expanding services to our existing homeowners. With our new Board Members, we should be able to do some of the things we've always thought we should be doing but did not have the resources to do.

Our website had been suffering for a few weeks. It's back and running well. We have a new look and feel. We've also added some new features (security, backups, email communications, to name a few) to the site. Please visit: www.lnhabitat.com.


Family Selection

In addition to his profound impact on the community through RGH, Donald also has a long history of professional achievements and public service, including membership on the Northern Neck Planning Commission, the Youth Mentoring Program, and the Free Health Clinic. He founded and still leads the Smart Start for Success Youth Empowerment mentorship program that has officially served the youth in our community for the past five years. He also served on the Board of Directors of the National Board of Surgical Technologist for eight years. He is the first African American elected to the Lancaster County board of Supervisors, serving for 12 ears with one year as the Chairman and Vice Chairman, before he resigned to dedicate his full attention as Pastor of the Church of Deliverance in 1999. He served five years as Music Minister at Queen Esther Baptist Church before he was ordained in 1998. God has moved mightily under his leadership, and Donald continues to touch lives through his dedication, commitment and sacrifice.



Edna Davenport serves as the Director for Lancaster County Department of Social Services. Prior to her appointment as Director, she served as the Benefits Supervisor in the department. She has also worked as Benefit Supervisor with Essex Department of Social Services. Edna has 30 years of social service experience.
